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

Points to remember in making reservations:

- When using the online link, enter the group code DKG.
- May 31, 2016, is the deadline for the special rates of \$135 plus taxes (king suite) and \$145 plus taxes (double suite), as well as the deadline for TSO to meet our guaranteed block. Rates are good for up to four people per room.
- Reserve only the number of rooms that you need. You must give the names of all the persons who will be staying in the rooms you reserve. Guests will be allowed to make only one reservation per guest name.
- Complimentary made-to-order breakfast, manager's reception in the evenings, full-range fitness center, spa, indoor pool, free shuttle service within three miles, and attached conference center are among the amenities.

If the Embassy Suites by Hilton becomes filled, an additional hotel will be added. Watch the TSO website for new hotel information.

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Additional Convention Information

Hotels and Amenities

The 2016 Frisco Convention has three hotels. First is the convention hotel: Embassy Suites by Hilton, and the Frisco Conference Center is attached to it. Next are the two overflow hotels directly north across the street from the Frisco Conference Center: Hilton Garden Inn and HYATT house.

Wow! By mid-January TSO members had reserved all of the Embassy Suites by Hilton's DKG block of rooms! If you still need to reserve a room, rest assured that amenities at the three hotels are similar, such as complimentary hot breakfast, Wi-Fi, and shuttle service within a designated area. And, prices are the same at \$135 for a king suite and \$145 for a double queen suite.

A heads-up for the overflow hotels: If you need to reserve a room for Wednesday night and/or if you prefer a tub to a shower, you will probably want to make your reservation at HYATT house. Just indicate your preference for a tub under "Special Request." (See p. 2 for hotel registration info)

(2) Also on the home page, look for Are You Ready for Some Baseball?

There you'll find a quick **intro** to our Friday night event, a RoughRiders logo, and two **links**: **HERE** (which takes you to Friday night baseball game details and ticket info), and **RoughRiders Video** (which is a fast-paced six minutes about Teddy Roosevelt and the Frisco RoughRiders).

(3) Click on Convention Website.
