#### **Legislative News**

This month I am sharing some news from TRTA Legislative Chair concerning TRS-Care. I believe that all of us need to be aware of the situation whether actively teaching or retired.

If you are not aware of the situation, here is some of the information shared at a recent Senate Finance Committee meeting. There is an impending \$1 billion TRS-Care budget shortfall. If nothing is done during the coming legislative session to resolve this funding issue, TRS-Care participants could see astronomical premium increases as high as 130 percent.

Here are some things that he suggested we do this fall:

- 1. Talk to our legislators! In 2015, we need the legislators to prevent the impending shortfall of TRS-Care by increasing the allotment. Be sure to share with them how TRS-Care impacts you!!
- 2. Communicate with your fellow TRTA members and get them involved in the fight!
- 3. Reach out to retirees who are not members. The stronger we are as an organization, the better the outcome will be for all of those affected by the TRS-Care crisis.
- 4. Engage with active educators in your area. The changes made to the retiree health insurance program in 2015 will impact them too!

#### Points To Ponder...

October 1 marked the first day of Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Even though the existence of domestic violence is ever present in our minds and in the media wave, in October, as educated, concerned women, we can make quality time to focus more profoundly on those who have experienced or who are experiencing some form of abuse (be it physical, verbal, or mental) at the hands of an intimate partner or a spouse.

During the month of October as discerning, caring women let us mourn those who have lost their lives to physical abuse, celebrate those who have successfully broken the bonds of the abuse and have survived, and connect to one another as we labor together to help end the abuse of all peoples in our world.

Domestic violence/abuse thrives on silence. As strong, courageous DKG women let us take a vocal, visible stand to help obliterate this insidious cancer that has too long been a hidden disease in our culture as well as in other cultures throughout our world.

What can we do to help eradicate abuse? We can help to end it by sharing with our families and friends that we don't tolerate verbal or physical abuse of others. We can help to end it by supporting programs or shelters that promote safety and refuge to hundreds who seek to break the bonds of repeated abuse. We can help to end abuse by consistently striving to ensure that our communities hold the abusers accountable for their misdeeds.

DKG is grateful for people in our communities such as Dallas Mayor Mike Rawlins who has made a special effort to focus on holding abusers accountable. We commend him for taking a stand for all peoples. As "staunch, courageous" DKG women may we always be mindful of our sisters throughout our world who face abusive situations on a daily basis.

"Around the world, at least one in every three women has been beaten, coerced into sex or otherwise abused during her lifetime. Most often, the abuser is a m e m b e r o f h e r o w n f a m i l y . " (www.domesticviolencestatics.org)

During the month of October, Theta Alpha remembers its sisters who have undergone or who are undergoing treatment for breast cancer. Our love and concern are continuously with these brave, positive sisters.

Theta Alpha also remembers those sisters who for numerous months so courageously fought the battle with breast cancer as well as other cancers. They are with us in spirit and are forever in our hearts.

The American Cancer Society offers several recommendations for early breast cancer detection in women without breast symptoms. They are as follows:

\*Women age 40 and older should have a mammogram every year. Mammograms should be continued regardless of a woman's age as long as she is in good health.

\*Women in their 20s and 30s should have a clinical breast exam (CBE) as part of a periodic (regular) health exam by a health professional preferably every three years. Starting at age 40, women should have a CBE by a health professional every year.

\*Breast self-exam (BSE) is an option for women starting in their 20s. Women should be told about the benefits and limitations of BSE. Women should report any breast changes to their health professional right away. (www.cancer.org/cancer/breastcancer)

Remember that early detection of any cancer is paramount whenever treating the disease.

FYI: Colors for ribbons or clothing that show "cancer awareness:" (1) pink, breast cancer;

(2) orange, kidney cancer; (3) purple, all cancers.
